






SUSANNE'S WORK HAS THE FOLLOWING LIMITATION

The language used on online platforms changes fast, which has to be handled by the system somehow.

The quality of the text is very important for language modeling. For example, multilingualism and speech-to-text transformations are currently a challenge.

NOTIONES

CARLA HAS THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS

As a researcher, she has only limited access to the practitioners' requirements and can therefore barely realize new solutions tailored to intelligence and security activities.

She is completely dependent on cooperation with technology developers and practitioners.

- can identify threats to national security;
- can identify persons behind the anonymous profiles who participate in or direct darknet activities
- can help her prevent and deter organized crime relating to child pornography

- to gain an overview of relevant practitioners involved in the field
- to research the state of the art of Artificial Intelligence algorithms and tools at the service of the Intelligence and Security practitioners

JOHAN'S WORK HAS THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS

While modern imagery offers great possibilities to detect and identify all kinds of targets, specific knowledge is still required to select the appropriate data source, be able to collect and process the data, or even be aware of the technology's capabilities and limitations. However, there exists a lack of awareness and capabilities in these regards.

JOHAN IS LOOKING FOR A SOLUTION WHICH

- allows it to combine new technology for aerial imagery with the military's existing strategic software and
- can find and adapt advanced artificial intelligence-based computation suitable for use in the field

JOHAN IS USING SOLUTIONS WHICH

- collect intelligence and monitor platforms to detect and prevent organized crime,
- secure data sharing and dissemination (internally and externally) and
- applies Image and Signal based intelligence (IMINT and SIGINT).

KRISTOFFER HAS THE FOLLOWING LIMITATIONS

Even though a lot of threats are spread through online media, Kristoffer is not able to search the world wide web for potential threats on his own.

More training is required to educate employees on online safety.

Multiple pieces of software are used at once, which often generates certain limitations during the exchange of information.

KRISTOFFER IS LOOKING FOR A SOLUTION TO

- counter potential terrorist threats via social media,
- increase communication with the intelligence services for better identification of potential threats and
- communicate the needs of his government to the security practitioners.

- data enrichment from external databases and
- decision management.





Supported by the G20 Inter Faith Forum and the United Nations Interregional Crime & Research institute (UNICRI) the PROTECTOR project will enhance security postures at places of worship to counter the threat from hate crime and terrorism.

The strategic objectives of PROTECTOR are:

- 1) To conduct a thorough **assessment of hate crime and terrorism threats** to places of worship.
- 2) To conduct a thorough **analysis of Law Enforcement Agency policy, practice and procedure** when responding to reported incidents at places of worship.
- 3) To **strengthen protective security postures** of places of worship.

PROTECTOR – An introduction

- 5) To **establish and strengthen cooperation** between public authorities, faith-based leaders and congregations.
- 6) To **develop a security awareness raising campaign** for places of worship.
- 7) To **develop** Law Enforcement Agency, public authority and faith leadership **protective security expertise**.











The ALLIES project aims at supporting micro (and small) Hosting Server Providers (HSPs) in achieving compliance with the new requirements and obligations under the Regulation 2021/784 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 29 April 2021 on addressing the dissemination of terrorist content online also known as the Terrorism Content Online Regulation (TCO Regulation). The activities that will be carried out within the framework of the project aim to facilitate the day-to-day operation of HSPs via the provision of training, awareness-raising activities and software tools.

BENEFITS / IMPACT:

- Communication channels with **MICRO AND SMALL HSP**
- Training of HSP on the **TCO Regulation**
- Training on the detection of terrorist content and next steps to be taken for **MICRO AND SMALL HSP.**

To operate fire and rescue services in order to save lives and reduce property damage as a result of fires, hazardous materials incidents and rescue operations in routine and emergency situations


The Israeli National Fire & Rescue Authority is operating by force of the "*2012 National Fire Authority*" law, as transition from local organization to nationwide.

Approx. 2500 active firefighters + more than 5000 include volunteers, reserves forces

120 fire stations,
700 fire trucks

90,000 events each year.

EU-CORE Project

The overall objective of the CORE will be to develop a harmonized vision of crisis management awareness and capability. This can only be achieved through transdisciplinary collaboration involving the environmental science and social science communities.

CORE is a multi-disciplinary consortium established to understand how to define common metrics with respect to the different natural and man-made disaster scenarios, and how to measure, control and mitigate the impact on the populations. Particular attention and focus will be given to vulnerable groups: disabled, elderly, poor, as well as women and children.




CORE will identify and use best practice and knowledge / learning from certain countries, such as Japan which experienced high levels of seismic, volcanic and tsunami risks but where risk awareness is high.

CORE will devote great attention to education in schools.

Wild Fire in Jerusalem Mountains



Data & Numbers

- Total about 52 hours of continuous fire-fighting operation.
- Approx. 15,000 dunams of natural woodland were burned.
- Approx. 2,000 people were evacuated from their homes.
- 1,500 firefighters participated in this event (including military reserve forces, and volunteers)
- 1.5 million liters of aerial firefighting materials.
- 451 airstrikes and 238 hours of flying.
- Death and Injuries – None.
- Damages - three houses in this great fire were burned or damaged, and a few more warehouses/buildings at other levels.
- Manmade – purposed ignition

Outcomes

- Fixed template for debriefing and analyzing disaster
- Combine lesson learn, and field experience from different scenarios (focus on the effect not the cause)
- Further investigation of the Aerial Imagery application for emergency situation - Technology and Systems review, Integrative view of Aerial Imagery usage, Operational guideline

Conclusions and Recommendation


- Share knowledge for the international community
- Work closely with the operational event managers
- Mixture of literature review and personal interviews
- Access to internal documents is advantage but not a must
- Need to bypass the operational investigation limitation
- Use open data as a reflection to the internal material


